Listen and playalong to the Waltz of the Flowers. When the bees land on the flowers, make your sounds in time to the beat. Play 3 times when you see the special 3-triangle symbol. As the bees fly over the hills near the end how does the music make you feel?

There are different ways you can take part:

- On your own . . . use body percussion. Red=stamp, blue=tap legs, yellow=clap
- With your family or in class: each person has a colour and plays only on their colour. At the end, you get to play together!

If you want to use other sounds, it doesn't have to be the drum, tambourine and triangle. You could use: a box with a wooden spoon, a spoon on a tin and a pair of spoons tapped together!

If you are in school, you could tap the desk with your hands, tap a pencil on the desk, tap a chair leg with a ruler.
